Subject: Notice of Violation – California Fire Code Compliance for CO2 Systems

Dear XXXXX,

During a recent inspection conducted by the City of Eureka's Code Enforcement program, it was determined that your establishment is in violation of the California Fire Code (CFC) Section 5307.3.2 regarding the use and storage of Carbon Dioxide (CO2) systems for beverage dispensing. Specifically, your business did not meet the required safety standards, and as a result, all recipients of this letter are required to install a continuous gas detection system to achieve compliance.

Per California Fire Code Section 5307.3.2, businesses that store more than 100 pounds of CO2 must install continuous gas detection systems. These sensors must be positioned within 12 inches of the floor in areas where CO2 is likely to accumulate. Additionally, CO2 storage tanks must be properly mounted using bolts or safety straps to prevent tipping hazards.

Our inspection revealed the following violations at your business:

CO2 violation

To ensure compliance and maintain the safety of your establishment, you are required to correct these violations within 30 days from the date of this letter. Failure to address these issues may result in administrative citations and further enforcement actions under the Fire Code and Building Code to ensure the space is rendered safe.

We want to emphasize that our goal is to work with you in achieving compliance. These requirements are in place for the safety of your employees, customers, and the general public. Please reach out if you need assistance understanding the corrective measures, and we will gladly work with you to ensure a smooth compliance process.
